### Lake Gaston Weed Control Council

### **Expenses**

\$ 16.1M has been spent towards hydrilla control thru 2018 (\$500K/yr) Approximately 110,000 grass carp have been stocked (Dominion)

In the last 5 years a shift to research and integrate lyngbya into vegetation management


- > \$142K hydrilla control
- > \$677K research (NCSU)
- > \$3M lyngbya control (requires 6 treatments/yr)

#### 2024 estimate

> \$150k hydrilla & \$1.3M lyngbya (\$762/acre vs. \$2576/acre)

### Lake Gaston Stakeholders

- The organizations that have an interest in and can affect positive outcomes to Lake Gaston.
- Build on the success of hydrilla control (a \$16M investment).
- Recognize that lyngbya is of significant concern and that its control is
  of benefit to the recreational use and economic value for all of us.
- The difficulty and increased expense to control lyngbya requires:
  - **≻**Consistent funding
  - ➤ Solutions to legislative and administrative funding barriers
  - ➤ List lyngbya as a noxious weed

# Resolution-in support for:

- research and integrated Noxious Weed Management (<u>including lyngbya</u>) which addresses Lake Gaston's water quality, and biodiversity
- consistent funding and clear pathways that provide counties the legal authority to fund problematic algae management activities
- legislative and administrative solutions to list lyngbya as a Noxious Aquatic Weed under the NC DEQ Aquatic Weed Control Program
- cost share funding by all stakeholders, to include States, County jurisdictions as well as private entities
